We were very pleased with the report following the recent OFSTED monitoring visit. The inspectors acknowledged the significant improvements the school has made.

During feedback to senior leaders, Her Majesty's Inspector said that she was "amazed at the amount of work that has been done in the last 6 months" and "please commend the efforts of all the staff and pupils."

This has been recognised, and acknowledged in the report.

"The new principal has built an effective team, which has focused effectively on safeguarding as a priority. The team has tackled the shortcomings identified at the previous inspection"

The report also stated, "The leadership team, led by the principal, is vigilant in identifying and putting actions in place to ensure that the premises are well maintained and safe."

The newly appointed governing body is being trained to carry out their duties to the required standards.

The school will continue to work closely with the local authority to ensure that high expectations of pupil safety are maintained.

We are an independent fee-paying school and not state funded. We charge very low tuition fees to make it affordable to any family. We have closed the boys' secondary section of the school back in January 2017 purely for financial reasons, and certainly not due to Ofsted report. We are happy to confirm that we continue to run the girls' secondary section as well as the primary section (co-educational), and both sections are doing extremely well.
